Tale Summary	The summary of the tale is incomplete or unclear. Another student could not be reasonably expected to understand the tale following this summary.	The summary covers all important points of the tale. A student who heard this summary would have enough information to retell the tale.	The summary is thorough, clear, and precise. The presenter conveys numerous details in a memorable way.
Analysis	The analysis answering the questions in the assignment description is lacking or unclear.	All of the pertinent questions from the assignment description are addressed thoroughly.	The analysis of the pertinent questions is particularly insightful and complete.
Visual Aid	The visual aid adds little to the presentation. It may not be integrated well and shows evidence of hasty preparation.	The visual aid is unique, skillfully created, and significantly adds to the quality of the presentation.	The visual aid is impressive and integrates excellently with the rest of the project. It is the best medium for presenting the information it contains.
Stage Presence	The presenter's voice and manner while presenting detracts from the effectiveness of the presentation, hindering communication.	The presenter can be easily heard and appears confident while presenting.	The presenter exudes confidence and preparedness. The presenter's speaking voice is exceptionally expressive and clear.
Handout	The handout provides little information and is poorly formatted.	The handout is adequate and aids in the audience's understanding of the presentation.	The handout provides an excellent aid for the audience. Because of its attractive appearance and thoroughness, <u>reasonable</u> audience members are not tempted to throw away the handout.
